

## 0.1 gsource: Read Data As a Space-Delimited Table

### Description

The `gsource` function allows you to read a space delimited table as a data frame. Unlike `scan`, you may use `gsource` in a `sourceed` file, and unlike `read.table`, you may use `gsource` to include a small (or large) data set in a file that also contains other commands.

### Usage

```
gsource(var.names = NULL, variables)
```

### Arguments

`var.names`     An optional vector of character strings representing the column names.  
By default, `var.names = NULL`.

`variables`     A single character string representing the data.

### Value

The output from `gsource` is a data frame, which you may save to an object in your workspace.

data <- gsource(variables = "
    1 2 3 4 5
    6 7 8 9 10
    3 4 5 1 3
    6 7 8 1 9    ")

data <- gsource(var.names = "Vote Age Party", variables = "
    0    23 Democrat
    0    27 Democrat
    1    45 Republican
    1    65 Democrat    ")
